Kids do well if they can!

As a school we continue to embed Collaborative Proactive Solutions (CPS) throughout our school. Below is a little bit about the CPS thinking....

- Dr Ross Greene Our old ideas about behaviour modification are no longer efficient when ākonga are growing up in an ever complex world of uncertainty.
- Support ākonga to recognise and navigate the problems and the challenges in ways that they will experience in the future by actively involving them in the process.
- Taking the approach that "kids do well if they can," instead of "kids do well if they want to," shifts the lens from 'bad behaviour' being intentional to understanding that the child is likely to be lacking the skills to meet the expectation placed upon them and have problems that they are unable to positively solve for themselves.
- Moving from power and control to collaboration and problem solving gives us more opportunity to work with kids to teach critical thinking skills like flexibility, adaptability, frustration tolerance and problem solving.
