A little more about CPS (Collaborative Proactive Solutions)

CPS - Change our Lens

- Emphasis is on problems (and solving them) rather than on behaviours (and modifying them)
- 2. The problem solving is collaborative with the child
- 3. The problem solving is proactive, not reactive.
- 4. Kids do well if they can, and if they could do well, they would do well. Not true is attention seeking, manipulative, unmotivated or limited testing.
- 5. Doing well is preferable. We have been focused on motivation, when we should be focused on skills.

Maths @ Southbrook Update

As we begin to implement the refreshed Maths Curriculum, Southbrook has chosen to use Maths No problem as its maths programme alongside The Learner First maths learning that we have been part of since late 2023.

Maths No Problem is a mastery approach to learning maths -

Structured maths lessons Lessons build upon previous learning in a spiral structure, revisiting prior concepts to encourage essential connections and deeper understanding.	Whole-class teaching Everyone learns at the same pace and no one gets left behind. Content is differentiated by depth to support struggling and advanced learners alike.	Research-based approach Children learn using methods proven to help them develop a better understanding of abstract concepts: the CPA approach (Concrete objects, Picture representations and Abstract thought), bar modelling, iournalling.	Peer to peer learning Collaboration is key. Children are encouraged to work through problems in pairs or groups, promoting teamwork and building resilience.

(Lessons are parent funded)


